Enquiry Question: Savages or Civilised? What were the Ancient Maya really like?

Subject Specific Vocabulary	
maize	Another word for sweetcorn or corn on the cob. It can be made into a dough and baked into tortillas.
codex/codices	Ancient handwritten texts. Maya codices could be unfolded like a concertina. One text is called a codex.
hieroglyphics	A system of writing using pictures not words.
sacrifice	An act of slaughtering an animal or person or surrendering a possession as an offering to a deity (ruler or god).
jade	A green coloured mineral used as jewellery or for ornaments.
cacao	Cacao trees sprout pods directly from their trunks. When they are ripe, the pods can be broken open to reveal the beans, which can then be dried, roasted and ground.
scribe	People trained to write things down, either as an official record or for someone else unable to write.
civilisation	A human society with well developed rules and government, often where technology and the arts are considered important.
pyramids	A monumental structure with a square or triangular base and sloping sides that meet in a point at the top.
rituals	A religious or solemn ceremony consisting of a series of actions performed according to a set order.
mesoamerica	A historical region and cultural area in North America. It extends from approximately central Mexico through Belize, Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua, and northern Costa Rica.
settlements	A place, typically one which has previously been uninhabited, where people establish a community.

Key Knowledge

- The Maya were a civilisation who lived in Mesoamerica (now Central America) between approximately 2000 BCE and 900CE.
- They are known for being the first Mesoamericans to develop writing.
- They also had a sophisticated culture in which they lived in city states.
- They built spectacular monuments and stepped pyramids – some (e.g Chichen Itza) have become world tourist destinations in the modern day.
- Maya adults worked as farmers, warriors, hunters, builders, teachers and many other things. Children from noble families could learn maths, science, writing and astronomy, but poorer children were only taught their parents' jobs.
- They were also well-known for their advanced maths and calendars.
- Mayans engaged in many rituals, one being the game of Pok-a-tok (a ball game) but the main ritual being sacrificial, following their religion, worshipping many gods.
- Around 900CE, Maya cities became abandoned. No one knows for sure why this happened.



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
