| Subject Specific Vocabulary | |

| emails | the practice or system by which written messages are sent from one computer to another; electronic mail |
| fax machine | a machine for sending and receiving pages that are transmitted electronically over telephone lines to or from another such machine. "Fax" is short for "facsimile." |
| mobile phones | a portable telephone that can make and receive calls over a radio frequency link while the user is moving within a telephone service area |
| Morse code | a code in which letters of the alphabet or numbers are represented by dots and dashes or by short and long flashes of light or sound |
| Skype | an application for video calls, voice calls and messaging released in August 2003 |
| social media | websites for social networking, blogging and communicating ideas, messages, photos and other content. Most have age restrictions of 13+ |
| telegraph | a message sent in code by electronic means over wires. |
| text (SMS) messages | a short electronically send messages from one mobile phone to another |
