To create habitat pictures for the animals (linked to The Gruffalo).

Prime Area: Communication and Language


To listen to The Gruffalo and encourage children to join in with the repeated phrases.

Wow Moment: Gruffalo Hunt
(no cost involved)

Specific Area: Literacy

To recognise and write their own name.

To recognise other children's names.

To introduce letter sounds - s, a, t, p, l, m, n, d

To write for different purposes - labels, birthday cards, lists

To learn how to handle and look at books correctly.

To make a rhyming board (linked to The Gruffalo's Child and The Gruffalo).

Prime Area: Physical Development

To gain an awareness of space and other people within the space.

To move like different animals from the Gruffalo stories - (though gymnastics).

To take part in 'Write Dance.'

To gain control over fastenings when getting dressed and undressed for P.E sessions.

To use a correct pencil grip and gaining control with mark making implements.

To continue to develop fine motor skills through the use of finger gym activities.

To take part in Forest Schools in the school grounds.

Specific Area: Expressive Arts and Design

To take part in role play activities.

To sing songs and nursery rhymes.

To learn songs for the Harvest Festival.

To investigate instruments to make sounds like the animals from The Gruffalo.

To make our own Gruffalos - using playdough and decorations.

To paint/collage a collaborative Gruffalo picture.

Specific Area: Mathematics

To be able to say and use number names to 20.

To count reliably.

To recite numbers forwards and backwards through song and rhyme.

To find 1 more and 1 less than a given number.

To sort objects and shapes based on different colours, sizes and shapes.

To create repeating patterns (linked to Harvest).
