To know how to explore music with a focus on disco, friendship, hope and unity.

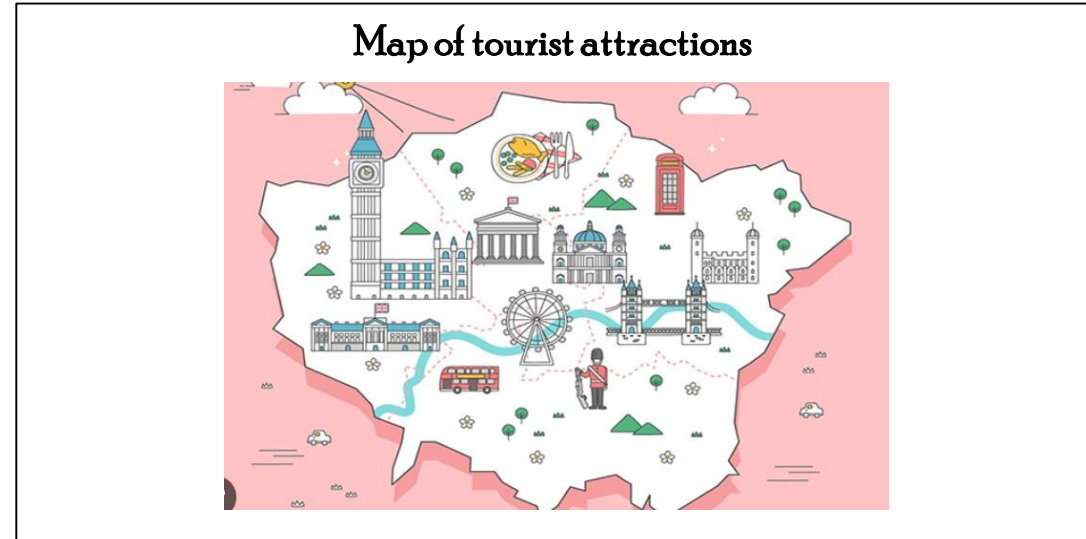
