Develop and train Sports Leaders within the school.	Children from KS2 collect data from teachers for the Golden Mile and input into the computer.	Certificates have been handed out in celebration assembly.
Purchase curriculum resources to aid the teaching of PE and progression of skills.	Extra resources have been purchased to enhance lessons – badminton rackets, lacrosse equipment, pommel horse....	The resources have helped progress children's skills further.
Develop the stamina of pupils by taking part in the Golden Mile on a weekly basis.	All classes take part in the weekly running sessions, the amount of time increases each week to build on their stamina.	Competed in the partnership cross country tournament. A fantastic effort all round.
Run sessions to support children to reach their physical ability – Change for Life sessions in Year 3,4 & 5.	12 children have taken part in key skills activities.	This has built on confidence, co-ordination and general fitness.
To set up different sporting experiences for the children – tennis, fencing, golf, cricket... and skill up the teachers.	The whole school took part in an archery, karate and tennis session. 2 classes benefited from London Welsh coming in to teach tag rugby. 2 classes benefited from Chance to shine cricket coaches coming in.	This has allowed children to be offered a wider range of sporting activities with the opportunity to take on these sports outside of school.
Observe all teachers undertaking PE sessions and offer advice / further support.	All teachers were graded based on Ofsted guidance. FW, DT and RC developed their professional knowledge on how to observe a PE lesson.	Teachers are more confident teaching PE, they feel supported and have the resources to teach successful PE lessons.
Train our Play Leaders and Lunch Time Supervisors.	Attended a playground leaders course at KAs.	Children will pass on their knowledge to the new sports leaders for the coming year. Lunch time games will then be organised.
