

	Top Up Swimming - £715 for 5 weeks of 1 hour	8 year 5 children and 4 year 6 children went swimming weekly in order to achieve the 25m expected distance by the end of year 6. 2 year 6s have achieved it and 6 year 5 children achieved the expected distance.			
	Chance to shine cricket coach to work with Year 3 and 6 and run an After School Club -£150	The Chance to Shine coach worked with Year 3 and 6 and upskilled class teachers on how to teach cricket. He also supported the after school cricket club with 38 children in attendance.
