Term 1 and 2	£467.08 - overspend from last year (2017/18)	
	£450 KAs- bronze sports package, this includes training for staff and all inclusion in partnership competitions.	School will automatically be entered for competitions. Have taken part in cross country with Years 5 & 6 boys getting through to the Vale round, tag rugby and football.
	Premier sport an afternoon for 10 weeks, teaching 2 classes Years 3 and 5 (including after school club)	Enhance PE lessons - Years 3 and 5 have undertaken 10 weekly gymnastics sessions, this has upskilled different teachers and allowed the children to develop new skills. The lessons were planned for and the teachers delivered the lessons every other week.
	Tag Rugby after school club	After school club has been open to all of ks2 - this has allowed a variety of children to take part in this sport.  Term 1 - Total for premier sports - £1486
	FW-K to organise playground leaders sports club at lunchtimes -	Sports leaders have been trained and are now running successful lunch time clubs. It is open to all children and there are separate KS1 and KS2 lunch time activities. The children choose an activity from a folder provided by FW-K and this is written



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organised games – 2 children from last year to help organise. up around the school and the name of the game is shared in celebration assembly.

This allows children to play nicely alongside others they may not normally choose to.

Continue with Wake and Shake by carrying it out in the morning in classrooms no cost This has been a very positive change. Wakes children up in the morning. Staff join in with the children, which they love and they can follow video clips on the interactive white board.

Subsidise some swimming costs for Years 2 and 6 at Faringdon Leisure Centre - cost of £1350

Year 2 and 6 have had 10 sessions of swimming.

Since the 2017 to 2018 academic year, there is a new condition requiring schools to publish how many pupils within their year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. 2 out of our 27 Year 6 children have not currently met the requirement – will look into Top Up sessions in the Summer Term.

Rubber mulch around trim trail - paid from sugar tax money and extra capital funding Safety surface is in place and is much safer for the children to use while on the trim trail.



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	Gymnastic competition entry £30.00. BGSA affiliation £12.00.	We have registered with the BGSA and Sarah has entered the relevant and appropriate competition. This is a great opportunity for the children to perform at an amazing venue against some strong talent.
	Dance Club entry - perform at the new theatre £25.00	Dance Club is very popular this year and nearly 40 of the members performed on the New Theatre Stage. They did a magnificent job in front of a huge audience.
	Football affiliation £10.00 and match £5.00	We have registered with the football and are attending some matches - some cost, others do not. This allows the children to play against others.
Term 3 and 4	Synthetic ice rink - £1900	Allowed the children to have a unique and for many, a first time experience. All children had a go during their ice skating session. Was an amazing way to start the academic year, the children rushed back into school.
	Premier sport an afternoon for 10 weeks, teaching 2 classes Years 4 and 6 (including after school club)	Enhance PE lessons - Year 2 are undertaking 10 weekly gymnastics sessions and Year 6 are learning basketball skills, this is upskilling different teachers and allows the children to develop new skills. The lessons are planned for and the teachers delivered the lessons every other week.

Have taken part in inclusive dance (SEND), basketball, sportshall athletics, hockey, badminton, boccia (SEND) getting through to County finals and winning, netball getting through to Vale then County finals and coming second, swimming getting through to the Vale finals and football.
	Frisbee Set purchased for £114.85	Will allow a Frisbee club to run during the Summer Term.


