The lessons were planned for and the teachers delivered the lessons every other week.</p> <p>After school club has been open to all of ks2 - this has allowed a variety of children to take part in this sport.</p> <p>Term 1 - Total for premier sports - £1433</p> <p>Sports leaders have been trained and are now running successful lunch time clubs. It is open to all children and there are separate KS1 and KS2 lunch time activities. The children choose an activity from a folder provided by FW-K and this is written up around the school and the name of the game is shared in celebration assembly. This allows children to play nicely alongside others they may not normally choose to.</p> <p>This has been a very positive change. Wakes children up in the morning. Staff join in with the children, which they love and they can follow video clips on the interactive white board.</p>

	<p>Subsidise some swimming costs for Years 2 and 6 at Faringdon Leisure Centre - <b>the school budget covers £1350 (not PE Funding).</b></p> <p>£300 - Mindful movements</p> <p>Rubber mulch around trim trail - approx. £11,000 (half would come from this budget and half from repairs and maintenance)</p> <p>Replace the A frame climber on trim trail that has failed its last safety inspection approx. £1,200</p> <p>Gym equipment - protection pad for beam £238.80</p>	<p>Year 2 and 6 have had 10 sessions of swimming.</p> <p>For the 2017 to 2018 academic year, there is a new condition requiring schools to publish how many pupils within their year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. 4 out of our 32 Year 6 children have not currently met the requirement - will look into Top Up sessions in the Summer Term.</p> <p>During Prayer and Friendship week we had a mindful movements activity day for Year 2-6 children to participate in. The children were encouraged to think about clear mindset. All took part. Foundation and Year 1 to have a session next term.</p> <p>This is to repair/replace existing mulch that is collapsing and allow a safe environment for the children to play on.
