Analysis

It is great to see such positive results. Obviously doing a questionnaire at this time of the year is a bit tricky for our foundation and new parents.

Even so the responses show that 100% of you strongly agree / agree with most of the areas:

- The school has a happy atmosphere
- The staff explain how I can help my child at home
- I would find it easy to approach the school with questions or concerns regarding my child(ren)
- I understand the school's policy concerning children being at school on time
- I understand the school's policy concerning children's absence from school
- The school has strong links with the church and local community
- I would be happy to recommend this school to another parent

For the parents who indicated 'disagree/strongly disagree,' we would recommend that you speak to the head teacher to try to resolve these issues.

In a few areas, some of you ticked 'don't know.' The main areas were:

- The school seeks the views of parents and takes account of their suggestions and concerns
- I am confident the staff teach my child(ren) how to stay safe online and who to go to if concerned
- The staff encourage the spiritual development of my child
- I am confident that the school deals with inappropriate behaviour effectively
- I know how to contact a member of the Governing Body if I need to

What we are going to do next

The areas where a higher percentage of you ticked 'don't know' or 'disagree' will be considered further at staff meetings and governor meetings, especially how to better inform parents of children new to the school. Any suggestions on how we can better inform new parents to the school of practises and policies please speak to the head teacher or a member of the governing body. We will also consider the areas for improvement that you recorded.





















The bits we can address now

- If you wish to contact a member of the Governing Body you can through the Governor Webpage under School Life on our School website: www.stanford.oxon.sch.uk or by a sealed letter to the main office, with 'For the attention of the Governing Body' written on it.
- The spiritual development of your child is addressed through Religious Education and PSHE lessons, our School Vision and Values plus other school activities like Forest School. Information about our Vision and Values is found on the school website: www.stanford.oxon.sch.uk under School Life Our School Vision and Our Christian Character. We have school collective worships and services at St Denys which allow you to evidence some aspects of your child's spiritual development.
- We seek parental views annually through this questionnaire with the results being analysed and
 discussed between staff and governors. We will also ask for feedback throughout the year on certain
 events and if we change or are considering changing something, for example the virtual parents
 evening meetings.
- Online Safety is taught as part of every lesson that involves using the internet. There are also specific computing lessons and PSHE lessons that focus on internet safety please refer to our curriculum document on the school website: www.stanford.oxon.sch.uk under curriculum and progression document. At the beginning of every academic year we ask you as parents and your children to agree to an acceptable use policy. We also recognise Safer Internet Week every year with a whole school assembly and daily lessons.
- The school has a positive behaviour policy and anti-bullying policy which explain how the school
 deals with inappropriate behaviour. They are both available on the school website:
